



ARCare, Inc. is a non-profit corporation, established in 1982, to serve a variety of needs for individuals with mental, physical and developmental disabilities.

The Programs:

1) The ARCare Plan provides long-term planning and support services for individuals with disabilities. These disabilities cover a broad spectrum, including developmental disabilities, mental illness, traumatic brain injury and physical disabilities, among many others. When family members or other participants are unable to provide coordination of services and advocacy, ARCare steps in and provides those services necessary to maintain stability and well-being for the individual.

2) The Representative Payee Program receives funds for individuals with a broad range of disabilities who cannot manage finances on their own. Designated by the Social Security Administration, ARCare assists more than 200 clients in the metropolitan area with paying their bills and planning their budgets. Payee services help ensure that a client remains in a stable setting, knowing that rent will be paid and utilities will stay connected. With stability, many clients are able to achieve greater self-sufficiency.

3) In 1996, ARCare established The ARCare Trust Program. ARCare is a unique trustee, serving only individuals with disabilities. The purpose of the ARCare Trust Program is to provide an efficient way of managing trust funds for persons with disabilities. At present, Arcare offers trusts in Kansas, Missouri, Nebraska and Oklahoma.

ARCare has two types of Special Needs Trusts. The Third Party Trust Program allows parents to leave resources to their child with a disability at minimal cost. The second type, the Self-Settled Trust Program, allows an individual with a disability to fund a special needs trust with their own money, and still retain government benefits.
